Reminder: Building Permits Are Required Before Starting Work

Planning a construction or renovation project? Don't forget — **a building permit is required before starting any work** within the Borough. This includes projects like roofing, additions, decks, sheds, fences, major plumbing or electrical work, and more. Obtaining a permit ensures your project complies with safety codes and zoning regulations. Doing work without a permit can result in fines and delays. **Before you begin, contact Richardson Inspection Services at 724-406-0031 or online at richardsoninspectionsservices.com** to find out if your project requires a permit. Property Maintenance Code

Property Maintenance Inspections attempt to ensure that residential and commercial properties in the Borough are safe, secure, and sanitary by being maintained in accordance with the international Property Maintenance Code. Thank you for helping keep our community safe and in compliance.

Burning Hours: Burning hours are Tuesday from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm **WITH A PERMIT ONLY**. There is NO fee for a Burning Permit, and they can be picked up at the Borough Office.

Grass: No Person owning or occupying any property within the Borough shall permit any grass or weeds to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed ten (10) inches. Upon notification from the Borough to cut any grass or weeds in violation of the ordinance, the owner or occupant of the premises will be given five (5) days to conform to these requirements. In case any person shall neglect, fail, or refuse to comply with such notice within the period of time stated, the Borough authorities will remove such nuisance at the cost of the owner or occupant of \$150.00 per hour. Reminder, it is Prohibited of any Mowed Grass, Weeds, Hay, Straw, Leaves, Shrubbery, Snow, Ice, Hail or any other objects to be blown, swept, raked, or deposited in the public highways, streets, alleys, or drainage infrastructure of the Borough.

Prevent Mosquitoes from Breeding in your Backyard: Empty, drain, remove, cover or turn upside down things that can hold water. Empty any small plastic wading pools and store indoors when not in use. Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets. Scrub and change water in bird baths weekly. Empty and refill pets' water pans daily. You can take these simple steps to reduce this menace at home.

Message from the Fire Department: Grilling Safety: propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors; the grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches; keep children and pets away from the grill area; keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill; and never leave your grill unattended.
